


#### 1ST SEM RESULT ANALYSIS OF 2019-2020



## **OBSERVATIONS (SEM-1, 2019-2020)**


#### **Analysis:**





### 4<sup>TH</sup> SEM RESULT ANALYSIS OF 2019-2020




# OBSERVATIONS (PART-3. 2019-2020)

# **OBSERVATIONS (PART-3, 2019-2020)**


- Qualified Student Percentage: Approximately 97.0% of the students qualified in Part III.

#### **OVERALL OBSERVATIONS FOR 2019-2020**

#### 1. Overall Performance:

■ The qualification rate is generally high across all semesters, ranging from 76.5% to 100%.

#### 2. Advance Learners:

■ The highest percentage of advance learners is in the 2nd semester, with 86.3%.

#### 3. Moderate Learners:

■ The highest percentage of moderate learners is in the 1st semester, with 59.3%.

#### 4. Slow Learners:

Slow learners are mostly absent across all semesters, except for one in the 1st semester.

#### 5. Not Qualified/Supplementary Learners:

■ The highest percentage of not qualified/supplementary learners is in the 1st semester, with 20.3%.
